But kindergarten readiness—the critical stage at which children are prepared for learning and success—is more than a matter of age. For a strong start in school, children need positive relationships and supportive learning environments beginning at birth. At First Steps, we partner with families, caregivers, and communities to ensure that all children are prepared for success.

For many families in Allendale County, the cost of quality child care is out of reach. Our scholarship program makes payments to child care providers to care for children from low-income families so their parents can return to school or work.

Allendale County First Steps offers scholarships to families enrolled in our Nurturing Parenting program, as well as income-eligible children whose parent attends school or works at least 30 hours per week.



100% the money paid to child care providers goes back into our local economy to benefit the citizens of Allendale County.



### NURTURING PARENTING PROGRAM

The Nurturing Parenting Program is designed to offer long term, more comprehensive parenting education. Parents & Their Infants, Toddlers & Preschoolers participate in a Home Visitation Program that utilizes a parenting curriculum that allows more interactive time between parent and child.


